
# Hong Kong as a metropolitan city situated in the chain of economic globalization producing a process of devaluation of the people, human labour and social connectedness

# 1. Social Economy (Europe)

Economy in 3 distinct sectors:



Social economy refers to voluntary and community—oriented economic activity falling in the third sector outside of the for—profit market sector, and the state—based public sector. (Craig, B. 2013)

### 2. Other economies are possible

- The iceberg is one way of illustrating that what is usually regarded as 'the economy' (i.e. wage labour, market exchange of commodities and capitalist enterprise) is but a small set of activities by which we produce, exchange and distribute values in our society.
- The iceberg opens up a conversation about the economy, honouring our common knowledge of the multifarious ways in which all of us are engaged in producing, transacting and distributing values in this *hidden* underwater field, as well as out in the air.


# 3. Reclaiming the Gift culturefrom homo economicus to homo giftus

### Alliance building

- Developing a common identity, whilst allowing the necessary diversity of context and intention, exchanging information and experiences of praxis, team work and collective decision making
- Including St. James Settlement, Hong Kong Women Workers Association, Market of Talents for Mutual Support of NAAC, Fair Circle, The Greenwise Workers Cooperative Society, Partnership for Community Development, Community Development Initiatives, Concerning CSSA and Low-income Alliances, academics and others.

#### Resilience in economic crisis

- Cooperatives empower their members and strengthen communities. They
  promote food security and enhance opportunities for small agricultural
  producers. They are better tuned to local needs and better positioned to
  serve as engines of local growth. By pooling resources, they improve
  access to information, finance and technology.
- Cooperatives are also critical in supporting indigenous communities, and in offering productive employment opportunities for women, youth, persons with disabilities, older persons and others who face discrimination and marginalization.
- The global financial and economic crisis has also demonstrated the resilience of alternative financial institutions such as cooperative banks and credit unions.
